Save the Date! We are about 4 months away from the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage when our parish of St. Cecilia is scheduled as a stop on the National Eucharistic Revival Pilgrimage Tuesday June 18, 2024. The National Eucharistic Pilgrimage will accompany Jesus from city to city, lighting hearts on fire along the way. Then, at the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis in July 2024, all these flames will blaze together. There will be four routes, with pilgrims walking for 60 days. We can participate by joining the pilgrims for a 2 mile Eucharistic Procession from St. Michael's to St. Cecilia's in Hastings, NE!

During Lent and Easter, as we celebrate this year of Eucharistic Revival in the United States I would like to propose we read Sacramentum Caritatis ON THE EUCHARIST AS THE SOURCE AND SUMMIT OF THE CHURCH'S LIFE AND MISSION. Pope Benedict XVI wrote this document in 2007 with the goal of offering some basic directions aimed at a renewed commitment to eucharistic enthusiasm and fervor in the Church. It is divided into three parts: The Eucharist, A Mystery To Be Believed, A Mystery To Be Celebrated, A Mystery To Be Lived. I hope you can read the full document along with me and I will attempt to give a summary each week in the bulletin leading up to Corpus Christi. 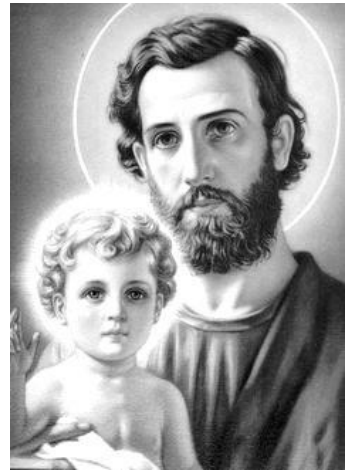

Lenten Regulations for the Diocese of Lincoln 2024:

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence.

All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence. Fasting means eating one full meal with two smaller meals, which together do not equal the full meal. No snacks or eating between meals allowed. Fasting obliges Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59.

Abstinence means eating no meat nor soup nor gravy made from meat. Abstinence obliges all Catholics over the age of 14.

Sickness, hard manual labor, pregnancy, etc., automatically excuse a person from these obligations. Nevertheless, it should be pointed out that these are serious obligations. In cases of doubt or question, the priest who hears a person's confession should be consulted.
