2022 Lenten Guidelines:

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence. In addition, all Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of fasting.

Fasting: The norms on fasting are obligatory **from age 18 until 59**. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

Abstinence: The norms regarding abstinence from meat are obligatory from **age 14 onwards**.

Information for plenary indulgences:

What is an indulgence: An indulgence is a remittance of temporal punishment due to sin whose eternal punishment has already been remitted. An indulgence is either partial (some punishment remitted) or plenary (all remaining punishment remitted).

A plenary indulgence can be earned only once a day. To obtain it, the faithful must, in addition to being in a state of grace:

- o have the inner disposition of complete detachment from sin, even from venial sin;
- o have sacramentally confessed their sins;
- o to receive the Holy Eucharist (it is certainly better to receive it while participating in Holy Mass, but for indulgence only Holy Communion is required);
- o pray for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff.

It is desirable, but not necessary, that sacramental Confession and especially Holy Communion and prayer for the Pope's intentions be carried out on the same day as the indulgent work is carried out; but it is sufficient that these sacred rites and prayers be carried out within several days (about 20) before or after the act of indulgence. Prayer for the Pope's intentions is left to the choice of the faithful, but an "Our Father" and a "Hail Mary" are suggested. A sacramental Confession is sufficient for several plenary indulgences, but a separate Holy Communion and a separate prayer for the Holy Father's intentions are required for each plenary indulgence.
